Cayman International school is accredited by the Middle States Association. CIS is authorized to present the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme from September 2008.

Calendar:

There are 182 days in the school year which are divided into 4 terms. The 1st term begins in August and the 4th term ends in June.

The School: CIS is a co-educational, college preparatory day school governed by International School Services. CIS was founded as Faulkner Academy in 1994. Today it is housed in a new, purpose built 57,000 square foot facility on 13.2 acres that opened in the fall of 2006. In addition to the United States High School Diploma, students can earn the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

Student Body: At the beginning of the school year there were 462 students enrolled in the whole school (Early Childhood to Grade 12), 65 in the high school, and 13 in the senior class. Students represent 31 nationalities and the majority of students are dual passport holders. Approximately 30% of the student body is Caymanian. 100% of seniors are currently enrolled in International Baccalaureate courses.

Faculty: There are 68 full-time staff members, 4 part-time faculty members, and 4 full-time administrators at CIS. The staff consists of 32 U.S. citizens, 12 Canadian citizens, 7 British citizens, and 19 expatriates from various additional countries.

Curriculum: All students are enrolled in a college preparatory program through an American based curriculum that is designed to respond to the individual needs of students. Small class sizes and highly qualified teachers encourage students to grow and develop to their fullest potential.

International Baccalaureate: The following courses are offered in Higher Level and Standard Level unless otherwise noted:

Biology, English A1, Geography, Mathematics (Standard Level), Mathematics Studies (not leveled), Spanish B, Theory of Knowledge (not leveled), and Visual Arts. Students also have the opportunity to take IB courses online through Pamoja.

Course Offerings: The following electives are being offered during the 2012-2013 year: Band, Broadcasting, Videography, Devised Performance, Health, Journalism, Organization & Development, Personal Fitness, Physics, Studio Art, Team Sports, and Yearbook.

Online Courses: Students at CIS are able to take online courses through Florida Virtual Schools and Pamoja. Students are enrolled in the following: IB Film, IB Spanish Ab Initio, AP Psychology, AP Spanish, Geometry, Latin, Computer Programming, and Life Management Skills.

CIS Diploma Requirements: A minimum of 24 credits must be earned, including: English (4), Mathematics (3), Science (3), Social Sciences (3), Foreign Language (2), Fine Arts (2), Physical Education (1), Technology (1), and Health (0.5). Students also must complete a minimum of 85 hours in community service.

GPA: Due to the transitory nature of the student body and the divergent schools from which they enroll, CIS does not report a cumulative GPA or class rank.

Extra-Curricular Activities: Students are offered a wide variety of extra-curricular activities, from varsity sports (interscholastic and international) to a school newspaper to peer mentoring. The activities change each semester according to the faculty and students' talents and interests.



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CIS International Baccalaureate Test Results

- In 2010, CIS students sat for a total of 23 IB exams; 74% of exams were marked at a 4 or higher.
- In 2011, CIS students sat for a total of 53 IB Exams; 91% of exams were marked at a 4 or higher.
- In 2012, CIS students sat for a total of 58 IB Exams, 87% of exams were marked at a 4 or higher.
- In 2011, 100% of IB Diploma candidates were successful in earning the IB Diploma.
- In 2012, 100% of IB Diploma candidates were successful in earning the IB Diploma.

CIS SAT Test Results

- 20 students took the SAT during the 2011/2012 school year. The average score was 1,637.
- 9 students took the SAT during the 2010/2011 school year. The average score was 1,453.
- 10 students took the SAT during the 2009/2010 school year. The average score was 1,518.
