




The recipient must be a CIS student for 1 year who has demonstrated commitment to others through some of the following:

LOOKING FOR SOMETHING TO DO THIS SUMMER? CCMI IS RUNNING A SUMMER SEA CAMP

What: Caribbean Marine Ecology Camp
When: Saturday August 3rd – Saturday August 10th 2013
Where: Little Cayman Research Centre, Little Cayman
Who: Open to High School Students (14 - 18 years old)

Join us at the Little Cayman Research Centre, Cayman Islands to learn about tropical marine ecology and conservation at one of the world's most stunning coral reefs. Students will benefit from lessons and interaction with experts in marine ecology. Divers and non-divers are accepted into the programme, but the Camp is intended for students who have an interest in marine ecology and conservation.

Here is a sample of potential activities:

- Scuba dive or snorkel with scientists.**
- Learn to identify important fish, coral, invertebrates and marine plant species and indicators of coral reef health.
- Assist with research on the invasive Lionfish by participating in dissections and stomach content analysis.
- Assist in conservation beach walk surveys of nesting Turtles.
- Learn about marine conservation and current conservation issues from our scientists and how you can save coral reefs from extinction.

*Students must be in good academic standing at their school. Qualified students are admitted on first-come, first-served basis. A maximum of 18 students will be admitted.

**Scuba certification is NOT required for the programme; however, students planning to dive must arrive already scuba-certified.

Cost

\$2,300 (US) International participants

\$500 (CI) Cayman Island residents eligible for scholarship*

*Please note the scholarships are based on funding availability. Please email us for more details before you register.

Cost includes room, three meals a day, pickup and returns to Little Cayman airport, all field trips and diving. Excludes airfare and travel/dive insurance.




did you know?
