Registration forms can be picked up from the front office, downloaded from the school website and have been attached to this newsletter.



Students in PreK3 through Grade 2 will be in A1 and students from Grade 3 – 8 will be in C4 for ASG.



Destination Imagination (DI) is a volunteer-led, cause-driven organization. Our purpose is to inspire and equip students to become the next generation of innovators and leaders. Last year CIS had 3 teams from the elementary level compete in the DI Challenge Program. This year we will be offering the DI program again and are hoping to include teams from elementary, middle, and even high school! Each year there are new and creative challenges in the areas of

STEM, Improv, Visual Arts, and Service Learning.

Each Challenge is open-ended and enables student teams to learn and experience the creative process from imagination to innovation. Teams may contain up to 7 children, and requires an adult Team Manager. A big part of the DI program is the Interference policy: in short, kids have to imagine, create and develop solutions on their own. Parents, Team Managers, family and friends can't suggest ideas or force teams in certain directions. Outsiders can only facilitate the acquisition of skills and knowledge.

If you are interested in learning more about Destination Imagination stop by our booth at the Elementary Parent Evening Tuesday evening and the Secondary School Parent evening on Thursday. Also, there will be an interest session **Friday September 5th in the ARC from 3:20-4:30.** During this time students will be given an overview of the process, and participate in some sample DI challenges. At **4pm, parents** are invited to come and chat with DI parents from last year to develop a stronger understanding of the program from the perspective of parents who had their children participate in the program before. UNIFORM POLICY SHOE CLARIFICATION

The updated CIS uniform policy (sent to families in June and available on our website at the following link: <http://www.caymaninternationalschool.org/page.cfm?p=392>) provides clear guidance regarding proper school attire for our students.

Please note: The uniform policy states that solid black or solid white shoes are to be worn with the regular school uniform for students in PreK3 through Grade 12. **PE shoes can be worn by Elementary students on PE days only**—these do not need to be solid black or white. Secondary students are required to change in/out of the their PE uniforms for PE thus when in regular school uniform they should where solid black or solid white shoes.



Mise en Place would like to thank parents for their patience and understanding during our first week of service. We regret that we have experienced some mi-



ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL YEAR FOR CIS IB STUDENTS

CIS has had another year of successful IB examination results. Our Class of 2014, who sat their exams in May of this year, maintained a 100% pass rate, for both certificates and the full

IB Diploma, for the fourth year in a row! The global pass rate for IB examinations is only 79%, so we are incredibly proud of our graduates for doing so well!

Each subject area performed better than the global average, and this year saw significant increases in the grades our students received in Geography and Maths Studies. Our full IB Diploma students scored an average of 30 IB points, which is equivalent to 3 A-Levels at A*, A, A, or 4 Group A AP subjects at 5, 5, 4, 4.* These highly impressive results are a testament to both our graduates and teaching staff for their hard work and we would like to congratulate them all on their successes.

We wish our Class of 2014 the best of luck with their future adventures, and look forward to a new year of challenges and successes with our Class of 2015!






