What is a Reading Expo?

It's that time of year again, where students celebrate their love for reading and share their favorite book with the CIS community! The Reading Expo is set up similar to a science fair, but it's all about books! Students will create projects about their favorite books, encouraging other students to read them. The goal of this event is to encourage and enhance reading at all grade levels, and celebrate the joy it brings when sharing it with others!

The students will have a choice to present their favorite book in 3 different categories:

- Fiction Storyboard Display
- Non-fiction Display
- Book Trailer Video

Students will create a trifold display or a book trailer to present their book of choice to their peers, teachers, parents and appraisers. Students may also choose to dress-up like their book character and/or bring suitable props for their Reading Expo presentation.

During the Reading Expo, the appraisers will be looking for creative projects that have incorporated all the required elements (use the checklist to help guide you). Each participant will receive constructive feedback, and be entered into our lucky prize draw!

Students will...

- Choose to enter as an individual or with a partner.
- Read or reread their favourite story or non-fiction book.
- Choose one category (Fiction Storyboard, Non-fiction Display or Book Trailer Video).
- Create their projects either using a tri-fold display board or book trailer (imovie/movie maker).
- Use the Reading Expo Checklist to ensure their project meets all the criteria.
- Label the display boards with their name(s) and grade(s).
- Present their projects on March 26 to the CIS community.
- Have fun and be proud of their project!
- Be entered into a draw to win a prize!
